Welcome to the 26th Annual Student Conference

We are so excited that you will be joining us at the Villa Roma for our Annual NYSTEA Student Conference. Please read the following information carefully so as to ensure a wonderful and positive experience for all.

What students should bring:

- O Appropriate comfortable clothes for workshops. Sneakers may be required for stage combat, dance and movement classes. Refillable water bottles are highly recommended.
- O A bathing suit for the indoor swimming pool and hot tub
- O Semi-formal attire for dinner on Saturday night & school-appropriate clothes for the Saturday night dances
- O Warm clothing for snow tubing and for walking outside to and from workshop spaces.
- O Yoga Mat or Towel for Morning Yoga!
- o Musical instruments, games etc. for use during activity times
- O Spending money for NYSTEA merchandise (t-shirts, hoodies, jewelry, etc), snacks, Broadway Cares donations and vendor items, credit cards accepted.
- O Tipping: Although it is not required, the Villa Roma Staff works hard to accommodate all of our needs throughout the weekend. Think about bringing along a few extra dollars to tip your housekeeping staff and shuttle drivers.
- O <u>Monologues and sheet music</u>. There will be opportunities for you to use them. Many workshops will be devoted to improving monologues and song presentation. Monologues can be adjudicated by the NYSTEA Adjudicators. Please check with your sponsor if you have been scheduled for a workshop that requires prepared materials. Auditions for Colleges and Summer Theatre Programs will also be available throughout the weekend.

College and Summer Theatre Audition information and requirements will be available on the website on or about November 1st.

It is a good idea to audition, even if it is just for practice. Students MUST sign up to formally audition for a college or summer program. These signup sheets are available in the lobby.

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Student Room Usage

Workshop sessions:

Students may not be in their rooms at this time. If students have a special need, they must go to the registration desk where someone will be available to escort them to their room. If a student is ill, their sponsor and the nurse will be notified.

Activity Times:

11:00 PM - 12:00 AM Students may return to their own rooms and halls. Doors must be left wide open at all times.

Students who wish to go to bed at 11:00 pm must inform their Sponsor. The door must be left ajar so that the Sponsor can make periodic checks.

12:00 Touchbase time in hall outside of sponsor's room.

12:15 AM - 12:30 AM Students return to their own rooms and prepare for bed.

12:30 AM Bed check. All doors will be closed and locked.

12:45 AM Lights out and quiet.

Saturday

2:00 PM – 4:00 PM Students may return to their own rooms briefly to change clothes. **Students may not "hang out" in rooms and may not be in other people's rooms.**

9:00 PM -11:00 PM Students may go to their rooms briefly to change clothes for activities. They may not "hang out" in rooms or in the hall outside the rooms.

After 9:30 PM students who return to their rooms will be required to leave their ID tags with a security host stationed in their area. They may retrieve their ID tags when they return from their rooms.

11:00 PM - 12:00 AM Students may return to their own rooms and halls. Doors must be left open at all times.

Students who wish to go to bed at 11:00 pm must inform their Sponsor. The door must be left ajar so that the Sponsor can make periodic checks.

12:00AM Touchbase time in hall outside of sponsor's room.

12:15AM – 12:30 AM Students return to their own rooms and prepare for bed

12:30 AM Bed Check. All doors will be closed and locked

12:45 AM Lights out and quiet.

If a student is ill and needs to return to their room, they must notify the registration desk. A chaperone will accompany the student to the room. The nurse and sponsor will be notified to make periodic checks on the student.

EXPECTATIONS

Wear your ID tags at all times.

Attend all Workshop Sessions, Touchbase Meetings, Playwright Showcase and the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.
